GRAFFITI ART

Mummie Mysteries

EXHIBITION

When you think of mummies, you may immediately think of Ancient Egypt, but animal mummies can also be found closer to home, here in Friesland. These often came into being 'by accident', as a result of natural conditions. The Natuurmuseum (nature museum) includes several mummified animals: a cat found in a crawl space, a rat discovered behind wallpaper, and a dried bat that emerged years later from a vase.

ICE SKATING

The Elfstedenhal is Leeuwarden's ice rink. The complex features a 400-metre track, a 30 x 60 metre central rink and an ice hockey rink. This is the ultimate winter outing: long-track speed skating, short track, ice hockey, figure skating, curling, kick sledding, precision skating, and much more. Work up a sweat on the ice and enjoy a warm hot chocolate afterwards. Extra fun: Family Fun Day on 18 January!

EXHIBITION

The Fries Museum presents an exhibition on one of the most important 17th-century portrait painters, Wybrand de Geest. His lifelike portraits of, among others, the Frisian Orange-Nassaus shine with pearls, soft velvets and finely painted lace collars. Alongside these works, the exhibition also features an album amicorum, a friendship book filled with contributions from friends and travel companions.
